#### 1.0 INTRA-MURAL EVENTS

# 1.1 Kings and Queens' and Mid-term Tests

The First Kings and Queens' Test was observed across schools and students did their best to emerge as kings and Queens. As a reward, the top performers were called out for recognition at the morning assembly. The results of the test have been uploaded on the students' portal. Mid Term tests have been concluded and students proceed on mid-term break. The results of the mid-term tests will be shared on the school portal as soon as they are ready. Students will be coming home with their test scripts (except those of the last set of tests taken). Parents and guardians are expected to review the scripts with their wards as well as encourage them to do any assignments given to them. They are also to admonish their ward(s) to continue to do their best in all school tests and examinations.

#### 1.2 Standard WASSCE and IGCSE Test

The standard WASSCE and IGCSE Test for SS1 and SS 2 did not hold as scheduled because of the Children's Day celebration. This preparatory test, however, has been postponed until after the Midterm Break. The test covers only English Language and Mathematics and follows the standard WASSCE and IGCSE procedure to prepare students for the examinations in their final year.

#### 1.3 Extra-Curricular Activities

The school continues to improve her efforts at providing an all-inclusive curriculum to make learners well-rounded while ensuring that extracurricular activities run effectively. # **Uniforms and Appearance**

- It is compulsory for Day Students to put on Blazers on Mondays.
- Sport wears are worn on Fridays at the Day College with white socks and white trainers.
- Girls are expected to comply with stipulated hair styles to be changed fortnightly.

- Hair extensions and locking of hair are not allowed. Free hairstyles that may be worn at any time include 'all back weaving' and 'kiko' with rubber
- Accepted footwear include a pair of black leather shoes (with black socks) on uniforms, white canvas (with white socks) on sport wears and Sandals/ trainers/school shoes on Saturdays (no slippers please).
- ISA Tops are worn on plain trousers/skirts/ Jeans / School joggers for Saturday lessons at the Day School.
- School Cardigans (not sports jackets) may be worn on uniforms on week days
- The Ambassadors Sports jackets may be worn on Fridays or Saturdays.
- No other cardigan, hoodies or jackets will be allowed in school
- All items of clothing should be tagged with the names of their owners for ease of identification

## **Punctuality**

Do kindly note that it is an offence to come late to school. School resumes at 7:30am Mondays through Fridays and the gate is locked at exactly 8am. In case of unforeseen circumstances, concerned parents are expected to send a text message (SMS not whatsapp) to the Principal ahead of time

This year's preparation has commenced earnestly and running simultaneously with the GCE syllabus and will extend to summer classes, which are mandatory for all SS2 students.

#### 3.4 International Examinations

Admirably, **SAT 2022** was epoch-making. All **42 students** received multiple admissions with varying scholarships. **22 students** have gotten full-ride scholarships while **7** others received full-tuition scholarships. Also, **over 10** have received their visa while many have visa appointments scheduled for June and most travelling abroad between July and August. **SAT 2023** registrations, however, have commenced for our outgoing SS3 students. The programme will run between **Mid-July** to **November**. This will simultaneously run with **IELTS** classes.

In addition, Parents should note that they can enrol their wards for the **A' Level** programme, newly introduced, during their gap year between **November 2023** and **June 2024**.

# 3.5 <u>Hostel Report</u>

### **Health Check**

It is highly recommended that the health status of our dear ambassadors be ascertained before they are being brought to school. We had many cases of our junior Ambassadors coming down with malaria the very first few days of resumption of this term. Having a routine check/treatment is not a bad idea as this will be a form of defense to ill-health.

## **Night Wears**

Parents are encouraged to personally check the luggage of their wards prior resumption to school. Kindly note that that the preferred night wears for girls are free gowns while pyjamas is preferred for boys.

We noticed that some students have bring in different T-shirts claiming it's their night wears, and they wear these under their school uniforms, sportswear, house wears and church wears at will. This has recently led to a breakdown of law and order as two girls were seen to remove their house wears during Prep. (This could only happen because they had T-shirts, which we consider as muftis underneath their house wears)

#### Socks

Kindly be reminded that the colour of socks expected from our dear ambassadors are **white** and **black**. Navy blue and ash colour socks are not part of the recommended colours and are not scheduled to be used any day.

#### **Sack Bags**

The recommended bags for our ambassadors are **suit cases**, and not **sack bags** popularly known as 'Ghana -must-go' bags; do kindly take note of this. The school expects strict compliance with this as the use of sacks makes the box rooms rather untidy and also open the children's provisions to attack by rodents.

# **Visiting Days**

This is a gentle reminder that parents/guardians are only allowed to come with food that their wards can finish at a time during visiting days. Remnants and extras will not be allowed into the hostel as we do not want cases of food poisoning as a result of this. In the same vein, do kindly note that the school frowns at parents giving food to pupils/students that are not their biological children or under their care during visits.

#### **Communication**

The management hereby requests for proper communication from parents whenever they have reasons to pick their children from the school. #### **Contrabands**

Overtime, we have had reasons to seize items that are **not allowed** in the school premises. These items have been confiscated and never to be returned. We urge our dear parents to do a thorough check on their wards before dropping them off in school. **Kindly note that contraband items seen with students at the point of signing in will <b>no longer be returned to the parents**.

The school expects parents to do a thorough check of their children's items and remove unwanted things before resumption checks at the school to avoid any embarrassment and unwarranted arguments.

#### 3.7 Entrance and Transfer Examination

So far, the admission examinations have been successful. The 1st Batch Entrance examination into Garde 7 was held on Saturday, **17th February**, **2024** while Saturday, 11th May, 2024, was for the 2nd Batch and transfer examinations.

These were all held in five centres: Ota, Lekki, Port Harcourt, Warri and Abuja. In addition, various rides of scholarships were given in the 1st Batch.

However, the admission exams continue with **Supplementary Batch** for Grade 7 and Transfer Examinations into Grade 8-9 and SS1-2 which are to hold on **Saturday, 27th July, 2024** at Ota centre only. Candidates applying from outside South West Nigeria or outside Nigeria can have their exams taken virtually. The form fee remains **\Particle\*20,000**.

Again, we appreciate every parent for the invaluable commendations and recommendations.

# 3.8 Reschedule of PTA General Meeting

The general PTA meeting scheduled to hold 1st June, 2024 has been rescheduled to hold on Saturday, **22nd June**, **2024**. We regret all inconveniences this change might cause you. Please, be assured that further necessary details will be communicated to you in due course.

#### 3.9 Payment of Pocket Money

This is to inform Parents that **Pocket Money Wallet** is different from the school fees portal. Hence, parents should endeavour to pay their ward's pocket money into their wallets. However, parents having challenges in accessing it should get through to the account officers for assistance.

## 3.10 Students' Appearance

This is to remind all parents that boarders are to compulsorily dress in their full school uniforms (with their blazers on) when going home for or resuming from holidays. Full compliance is expected from parents as students who default will not be allowed in or out of the school at such times. Hence, wearing muftis and house wears for vacations or resumption is not allowed.

Also, we will like to stress that the only accepted **footwear** at The Ambassadors Schools is a pair of black leather shoes, white canvas and black sandals. Other types of footwear, which do not meet the school's standard, will be deemed contraband and shall be seized forthwith.

Likewise, we wish to stress the need for students to resume with their **clippers**, for haircuts, most especially students of The Ambassadors Junior School. Hence, we implore parents to provide their ward(s) with this appliance for the sake of convenience and effectiveness in the services rendered.

It is compulsory for Day Students to put on Blazers on Mondays. Girls are also expected to comply with the stipulated hairstyles every week without any form of hair extensions.

# 3.11 Results and Document Uploads

A soft copy of the newsletter, as well as other documents, will be uploaded to the school's website. Parents will also be able to access these documents through their wards' portals. Furthermore, parents can check their wards' Midterm results online as of **Thursday**, **13th June**, **2024** by **4pm**. Parents should also check the portal for their wards' **holiday assignments**.

#### 3.12 Payment of School Fees

As a private institution, our source of generating income is through the payment of your children's/ward's school fees. Failure or delay to pay your children's school fees, therefore, will have negative effects on the smooth running of the school's programmes. Meanwhile, we want to appreciate our parents/guardians that made prompt payment.

Some parents/guardians are yet to fulfil their obligation as regards the payment of their children's school fees. **Therefore,we want to plead with parents in this category to pay up (their ward's school fees) as defaulters will not be allowed to resume after the midterm break.** Every other information as touching payment of school fees as well as other bills may be found on the school portal. We implore parents to visit the school website in time to check these updates.

It is our sincere prayer that God will bless you – our parents/guardians – greatly to meet the desired needs of your wards and the school.

# 3.13 Holiday Open Hours

The school will open from **9:00 a.m**. to **2:00 p.m**. (Mondays to Fridays excluding public holidays). #### 3.15 Open Day

Members of staff will be available to attend to all observations which is highly welcomed.

## 3.16 Resumption

**All boarders** are expected back at school by **Monday, 17th June, 2024** while the **Day students** are to resume on **Wednesday, 19th June, 2024** within the usual school hour. However, students who do not do well in the mid-term test especially in their core subjects will not go home for the break. They will have to stay behind during this period for different tutorials.

Parents/Guardians should note that resumption for boarders is between 9am and 5pm.

## 3.17 Conclusion
